

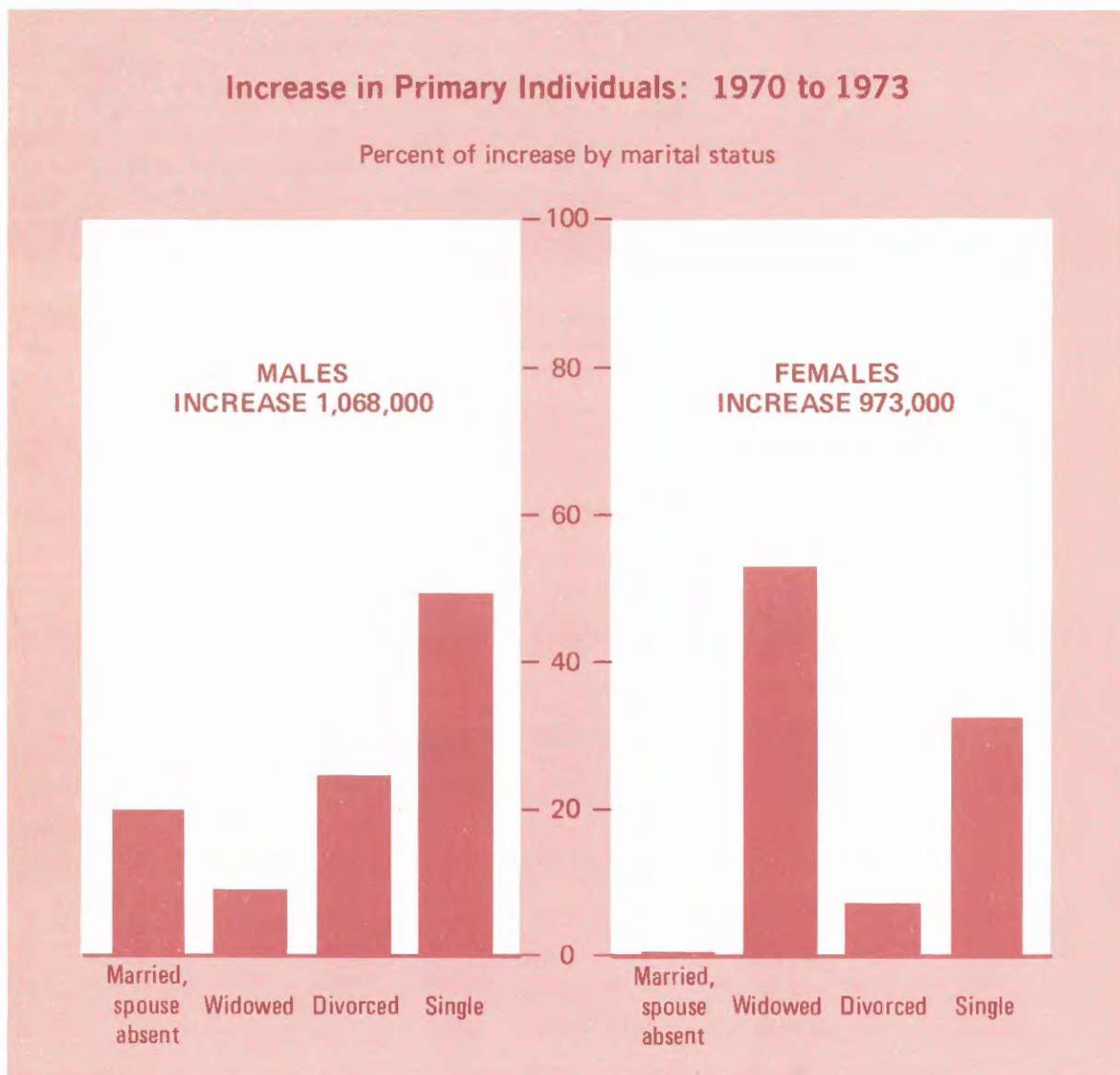

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MARITAL STATUS AND LIVING ARRANGEMENTS: MARCH 1973

This report presents detailed statistics on the marital status and living arrangements of the noninstitutional population of the United States. The report includes information on the marital status of the population 14 years old and over by age, race, sex, farm-nonfarm residence, family relationship, presence of parents for persons under 18 years old, and household headship by marital status for regions. The text highlights information on recent increases in young single males and elderly widowed females who reside as primary individuals; decline in percent of persons under 18 years old in families who live with both parents; increase in the median age at first marriage for men and women; and increases in the percent single for persons under the age of 35.

The data presented in this report were derived from the March 1973 Current Population Survey conducted by the Bureau of the Census and are subject to sampling variability, which may be

relatively large for the smaller figures and for small differences between figures. For a further discussion of the sampling variability, see the section on "Reliability of the Estimates."

INCREASE IN PRIMARY INDIVIDUALS

Between 1970 and 1973 the number of primary individuals in the United States increased by about 2 million (table A). Primary individuals are persons who maintain their own household while living in a house or apartment alone or with persons not related to them.

Both male and female primary individuals increased by about one million. For the male primary individuals the largest proportion of this increase was in the age group 14 to 34 years old (about 65 percent). By marital status, the largest proportion of the total increase was among single men (about 49 percent), most of whom were in the 14 to 34 year old age group.

The largest proportion of the increase in female primary individuals was for those 65 years old and over (about 53 percent). By marital status, the largest proportion of the total increase was in the widowed category (about 52 percent), with the majority of these widows being 65 years old and over. However, as was the case for males, a significant amount of the total increase for female primary individuals was for single females 14 to 34 years old (34 percent).

PRESENCE AND MARITAL STATUS OF PARENTS

In March 1973, about 83 percent of all persons under 18 years old, residing in families, were living with both parents (tables B, 4, and 5)¹. About 14 percent lived with their mother only, about 1 percent lived with their father only. The balance, around 2 percent, lived with neither

parent. The percent of persons under 18 years old in families who lived with both parents declined by about 3 percent between 1970 and 1973.

White children are much more likely than Negro children to be living with both parents. About 88 percent of all white persons under 18 years old who resided in families, were living with both parents. The corresponding proportion for Negroes was 52 percent. These figures represent a decline, since 1970, of about 2 percent for whites and 7 percent for Negroes. Thirty-eight percent of Negro family members under 18 years old lived with their mothers only, 2 percent with their fathers only, and 8 percent were living with neither parent. Among whites about 10 percent lived with mothers only, 1 percent with fathers only, and 1 percent with neither parent. Negro children who were living with their mother only most frequently had a mother who was separated, whereas white children who were living with their mother only most frequently had a mother who was divorced. Children who were

living in families where neither parent was present included grandchildren, nephews and nieces, and other relatives of the family head.

RECENT TRENDS IN AGE AT MARRIAGE

Since 1960 there has been a change in the percent single among both men and women in the United States. This change shows a higher proportion of persons remaining single under the age of 35 and a decline in the percent single among persons 35 years old and over (table C). Among persons under 35 years old the percent single for women increased by about 7 percentage points while the proportion single for men increased by about 4 percentage points. The increase of percent single is quite striking at ages where most women usually marry. Within the age group 20 to 24 years (the range of years in which the median age at first marriage for both men and women falls) the percent single for women increased by about 10 percentage points between 1960 and 1973, the corresponding increase for men was 4 percent. The increase in percent single at the younger

ages is also reflected in the median ages at first marriage for men and women (table D). Although both sexes have shown an increase since 1960 in the median age at first marriage, the age at first marriage for men has remained at a relatively constant level since the late 1960's while the median age at first marriage for women has moved gradually upward, increasing by about four-tenths of one year from 1967 (20.6 years) to 1973 (21.0 years).

By contrast, the percent single in the age group 35 years old and over has continued a long-time tendency to decrease. Thus, the proportion of men and women who remain unmarried beyond the age of 35 has declined in the last several years. Whether the present tendency of the young to remain single for longer periods will affect the percentages eventually marrying remains to be seen.

The median and quartile ages at first marriage shown in this report (tables D and E) are approximations derived from tabulations of marital status by age and may yield figures that differ somewhat

from those based on annual vital statistics or census questions on age at first marriage. For a discussion of the method used in estimating the median and quartile ages at marriage, see the section on "Definitions and Explanations."

When the figures on median and quartile ages at first marriage for different years are compared, caution should be exercised in the interpretation of small changes. Because of sampling variability of the survey data and the limitations of the estimating technique itself, the errors in the estimates of the median age may be slightly

larger than annual changes of one or two-tenths of a year of age. Moreover, there is evidence that computation of the median age at first marriage for men in some years is affected by changes in the distribution by single years of age within the age groups when most first marriages take place; this is particularly true for the birth cohorts of 1942-1943 and 1946-1947 when unusual month-to-month changes occurred. Annual changes of up to one-half year in the median for men may reflect this latter factor rather than any real change taking place in the ages of men at first marriage.

RELATED REPORTS

Figures for 1972 on marital status and family status were issued in Series P-20, No. 242. Figures on projections for the United States of the number of households and families from 1975 to 1990 have been published in Series P-25, No. 476. Additional statistics for years since 1947 on subjects covered in this report have been published by the Bureau of the Census in other reports in Series P-20.

Statistics on marital status for 1970 for standard metropolitan statistical areas, counties, urbanized areas, cities, States, regions, and the United States are presented in 1970 Census of Population, Volume I, Characteristics of the Population, chapter B, "General Population Characteristics." Detailed statistics on marital status and presence of spouse by age for 1970 for States and for large counties and standard metropolitan statistical areas are presented in Volume I, chapter D, "Detailed Characteristics." Similar data for the United States and regions, for 1960, have been published in 1960 Census of Population, Volume I, Characteristics of the Population, Part 1, United States Summary.

The 1970 census report Series PC(2)-4B, Persons by Family Characteristics, presents statistics on the marital and family status of persons 14 years old and over, by age, race, and sex, for the United States as a whole and for urbanized areas, and on persons under 18 years old by presence and marital status of parents, for the United States by type of residence, and for regions. In addition, this report shows all family members by age, sex, and family relationship by characteristics of the families of which they are members, including size of family, number of children, and education, occupation, and income of the family head.

The 1970 census report Series PC(2)-4C, Marital Status, shows detailed statistics on the marital status distribution of the population 14 years old and over by selected social and economic characteristics for the United States. Series PC(2)-4D, Age at First Marriage, shows detailed statistics for the United States on characteristics of persons 14 years old and over by age at first marriage, based on answers to questions on date of first marriage. In addition, the report shows average annual rates of first marriage per 1,000 single persons 14 to 79 years old in 1968 and 1969, for States. Statistics for 1970 on women by marital status, number of children ever born, and age at first marriage, are shown for the United States in Series PC(2)-3A, Women by Number of Children Ever Born.

DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

Coverage. The population in this report includes the civilian noninstitutional population of the United States plus approximately 979,000 members of the Armed Forces in the United States living off post or with their families on post in 1973, but excludes all other members of the Armed Forces. However, the data in tables D and E on median and quartile ages at first marriage for males refer to the total male population, which includes, in addition to the above, the male members of the Armed Forces overseas and in military barracks and similar quarters in the United States.

Farm-nonfarm residence. The farm population refers to rural residents living on farms. The method of determining farm-nonfarm residence in the present survey and in the Current Population Surveys since March 1960 is the same as that used in the 1960 and 1970 censuses but differs from that used in earlier surveys and censuses. Since March 1960 in the Current Population Surveys, farm residence has been determined by the responses to two questions. Owners are asked "Does this place have 10 or more acres?" and renters are asked "Does the place you rent have 10 or more acres?" If the response is "Yes," the respondent is asked "During the past 12 months, did sales of crops, livestock, and other farm products from this place amount to \$50 or more?" If the acreage response is "No," the inquiry relates to sales of \$250 or more. Rural persons in motels and tourist camps, and those living on rented places where no land is used for farming, are not classified as farm population. The nonfarm population, as the term is used here, comprises persons living in urban areas and rural persons not on farms.

Although the method of determining farm-nonfarm residence has not changed since March 1971, the underlying sampling methods and estimation procedures have changed. For a discussion of changes see Employment and Earnings, Volume 18, No. 8, February 1972, pp. 6-9, published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Age. The age classification is based on the age of the person at his last birthday.

Race. The population is divided into three groups on the basis of race: white, Negro, and "other races." The last category includes Indians, Japanese, Chinese, and any other race except white and Negro.

Marital status. The marital status classification identifies four major categories: single, married, widowed, and divorced. These terms refer to the marital status at the time of the enumeration.

The category "married" is further divided into "married, spouse present," "separated," and "other married, spouse absent." A person was classified as "married, spouse present" if the husband or wife was reported as a member of the household, even though he or she may have been temporarily absent on business or on vacation, visiting, in a hospital, etc., at the time of the enumeration. Persons reported as separated included those with legal separations, those living apart with intentions of obtaining a divorce, and other persons permanently or temporarily separated because of marital discord. The group "other married, spouse absent" includes married persons living apart because either the husband or wife was employed and living at a considerable distance from home, was serving away from home in the Armed Forces, had moved to another area, or had a different place of residence for any other reason except separation as defined above.

Husband in Armed Forces. When a woman was reported as married but her husband was not enumerated as a member of the same household an additional question was asked to determine whether her husband was in the Armed Forces. Women who were reported as separated were not asked the additional question.

Age at first marriage. The median age at first marriage, as shown in this report, is an approximation derived indirectly from tabulations of marital status and age. In computing this median, several steps are involved. First, the expected proportion of young people who will ever marry during their lifetime is computed. Second, one-half this expected proportion is calculated. And third, the current age of young people who are at this halfway mark is computed. From the assumptions made and the procedures used, it follows that the date of the survey is also the date when this halfway mark is reached. Half of the young people of the given age who will ever get married had done so prior to the survey date and half are expected to marry in years to come.

The quartile ages at first marriage divide people who will ever marry into four equal groups. The first quartile age is the age at which 25 percent of persons have married, the second quartile age (or median age) is the age at which 50 percent of persons have married, and the third quartile age is the age at which 75 percent of persons have married. The quartile ages are computed from the same distributions and involve the same assumptions as do the median ages.

In estimating the proportion of young people who will eventually marry, errors of 3 or 4 percentage points would affect the final estimate of the median age at first marriage by only 0.1 or 0.2 of a year. For convenience, the proportion ever married among persons 45 to 54 years old

was used. Other age combinations could have been used with little change in the results, so long as they included very few persons who would subsequently marry for the first time.

Data on marital status were available by single years of age in censuses and by 5-year age groups in the sample surveys. Sprague's fifth difference interpolation formula was used to estimate the percent ever married by tenths of a year of age from census figures and from the sample survey data. Since the interpolation was based on the percent ever married for 5-year age groups in the survey data, and since this percent is sensitive to changes in the distribution by single years of age within the age groups when most first marriages take place, the resulting median age at first marriage from the survey may fluctuate sharply in response to the major changes that have recently taken place in the age composition of the 20- to 24-year-old age group. The effect is marked in the case of the median age of men at first marriage because this median falls near the center of a 5-year age group. The median age of women at first marriage is relatively unaffected because little interpolation is required for its calculation; this median is now close to exact age 20, which is the lower limit of the age group.

The median age at first marriage computed from data on either annual marriage records or census questions on age at first marriage involves people over the full age span rather than just those in the vicinity of the halfway point. Median ages at first marriage based on these other records may be affected by changes in the age distribution of the population, whereas the median age at first marriage for a given date shown in the present report can be interpreted as applying to the cohort born "n" years earlier, where "n" is the median age at first marriage. Data on age at first marriage are available from marriage records only for certain States and from census questions only for selected dates.

When the figures on median and quartile ages at first marriage for different years are compared, caution should be exercised in the interpretation of small changes. Because of sampling variability of the survey data and the limitations of the estimating technique itself, the errors in the estimates of the median age may be slightly larger than annual changes of one- or two-tenths of a year of age. Moreover, there is evidence that computation of the median age at first marriage for men in some years is affected by changes in the distribution by single years of age within the age groups when most first marriages take place; changes of up to one-half year in the median for men may reflect this factor rather than any real change taking place in the ages of men at first marriage.

Household. A household consists of all the persons who occupy a housing unit. A house, an apartment, or other group of rooms, or a single room, is regarded as a housing unit when it is occupied or intended for occupancy as separate living quarters; that is, when the occupants do not live and eat with any other persons in the structure and there is either (1) direct access from the outside or through a common hall or (2) a kitchen or cooking equipment for the exclusive use of the occupants.

A household includes the related family members and all the unrelated persons, if any, such as lodgers, foster children, wards, or employees who share the housing unit. A person living alone in a housing unit, or a group of unrelated persons sharing a housing unit as partners, is also counted as a household. The count of households excludes group quarters.

Group quarters. Group quarters are defined as noninstitutional living arrangements for groups containing five or more persons unrelated to the person in charge. Inmates of institutions (starting in 1972) are not included in the Current Population Survey.

Family status. Within households, persons who are family members are distinguished from those who are not family members. A family is defined as a group of two or more persons residing together who are related by blood, marriage, or adoption; all such persons are considered as members of one family even though they may include a "subfamily," that is, a married couple or a parent-child group sharing the living quarters of the family head. A primary family includes among its members the head of a household, and a "secondary family" includes no member related to the household head. Members of secondary families may include persons such as lodgers, guest, or resident employees and their relatives living in a household.

Persons living with relatives in group quarters were formerly considered as members of secondary families. However, the number of such families became so small (37,000 in 1967) that beginning with data for 1968 (and beginning with the census data for 1960) the Bureau of the Census includes persons in these families in the count of secondary individuals.

In this report, persons who are not family members (that is, are not recognized as living with any relatives) are "unrelated individuals." Unrelated individuals are of two types--primary and secondary. A "primary individual" is a household head with no relatives in the household. A

"secondary individual" is a lodger, partner, guest, or resident employee with no relatives in the household or group quarters.

Income. For the noninstitutional population 14 years old and over, questions were asked on the amount of money income received in 1972. The amounts received represent income before deductions for personal taxes, Social Security, bonds, etc. Although the income statistics refer to receipts during 1972, the characteristics of the person, such as age, marital status, etc., refer to March 1973.

Years of school completed. In this report data on years of school completed were derived from the combination of answers to two questions, (a) "What is the highest grade of school that he has attended?" and (b) "Did he finish this grade?"

The questions on educational attainment applied only to progress in "regular" schools. Such schools include graded public, private, and parochial elementary and high schools (both junior and senior high), colleges, universities, and professional schools, whether day schools or night schools. Thus, "regular" schooling is that which advances a person toward an elementary or high school diploma, or a college, university, or professional school degree. Schooling in other than regular schools was counted only if the credits obtained were regarded as transferable to a school in the regular school system.

COMPARABILITY OF ESTIMATES FROM MARCH 1973 CPS WITH ESTIMATES FOR PRECEDING YEARS

The data for 1973 collected in the March 1973 Current Population Survey (CPS) are, in some instances, not entirely comparable to figures for earlier years because of revisions in the Current Population Survey. Starting in January 1972, 1970 census-based population controls, metropolitan residence definition, and other materials were introduced into the sample and estimation procedures. The major item affecting comparability at the overall national level is the introduction of population controls based on the 1970 census. Figures for previous years are tied in with 1960 census-based population controls. Basically, these changes should have no substantial impact on summary measures, such as medians and means, and on proportional measures, such as percent distributions. However, the changes may have more impact on the population levels in different subgroupings such as the total number of persons or families either overall, or within some particular category.

Other revisions in the March 1973 CPS are the use of 1970 census sampling materials for part of the sample, change in the average segment size from 6 to 4 housing units for part of the sample, change in the noninterview adjustment procedure for sample areas which are SMSA's, and change in the first stage ratio estimation procedure. In general, these changes are not believed to have any significant effect on comparability with figures for earlier years. A more detailed description of these revisions appears in the Bureau of Labor Statistics report "Employment and Earnings," Vol. 18, No. 8, February 1972.

SOURCE AND RELIABILITY OF THE ESTIMATE

Source of data. The data for this report for the years 1947-73 are based on results obtained in the Current Population Survey (CPS) of the Bureau of the Census. Any data before 1947 are based on the Decennial Censuses.

The present Current Population Survey sample, which was instituted between December 1971 and March 1973, is spread over 461 areas comprising 923 counties and independent cities with coverage in each of the 50 States and the District of Columbia. As of July 1971, approximately 47,000 occupied households are eligible for interview each month. Of this number, 2000 occupied units, on the average, are visited but interviews are not obtained because the occupants are not found at home after repeated calls or are unavailable for some other reason. In addition to the 47,000, there are also about 8,000 sample units in an average month which are visited but are found to be vacant or otherwise not to be interviewed.

From January 1967 through June 1971, approximately 50,000 occupied housing units were eligible for interview each month. From May 1956 through 1966 the corresponding number was 35,000. Approximately 21,000 households were eligible for interview each month in samples taken before May 1956.

The estimating procedure used for the 1970-73 data involved the inflation of weighted sample results to independent estimates of the civilian noninstitutional population of the United States by age, race, and sex. These independent estimates were based on statistics from the 1970 Census of Population, statistics on births, deaths, immigration and emigration; and statistics on the strength of the Armed Forces. (Report No. 225 in this series showed somewhat different figures for 1970 since the data in that report were inflated to independent estimates of the population based on 1960 census data.) For data collected in the

Current Population Surveys in the years 1960-69, the independent estimates used were based on statistics from the 1960 Census of Population.

Reliability of the estimates. Since the estimates are based on a sample, they may differ somewhat from the figures obtained if a complete census had been taken using the same schedules, instructions, and enumerators. As in any survey work, the results are subject to errors of response and of reporting as well as being subject to sampling variability.

The standard error is primarily a measure of sampling variability; that is, of the variations that occur by chance because a sample rather than the whole of the population is surveyed. As calculated for this report, the CPS standard errors also partially measure the effect of response and enumeration errors but do not measure any systematic biases in the data. The chances are about 68 out of 100 that an estimate from the CPS sample would differ from a complete census figure by less than the standard error. The chances are about 90 out of 100 that the difference would be less than 1.6 times the standard error, and the chances are about 95 out of 100 that the difference would be less than twice the standard error.

All statements of comparison appearing in the text are significant at a 1.6 standard-error level or better. Most are significant at a level of more than 2.0 standard errors. Thus, for most differences cited in the text, the estimated difference is greater than twice the standard error of the difference. Statements of comparison qualified in some way (e.g., by use of the phrase "some evidence") have a level of significance between 1.6 and 2.0 standard errors.

The figures presented in tables F, G, H, and I are approximations to the standard errors of various estimates shown in this report. In order to derive standard errors that would be applicable to a wide variety of items and could be prepared at a moderate cost, a number of approximations were required. As a result, the tables of standard errors provide an indication of the order of magnitude of the standard errors rather than the precise standard error for any specific item.

Table F contains the standard errors of estimates of the number of total or white persons in a given class. Table G contains the standard errors of estimates of the number of total or white households or families in a given class. Table G should also be used for items which can typically appear only once in a given household as, for example, "Number of household heads," or "Number of female household heads." To obtain standard errors from tables F and G for Negroes and other races, multiply these standard errors by a factor of 1.15.

The reliability of an estimated percentage, computed by using sample data for both numerator and denominator, depends upon both the size of the percentage and the size of the total upon which this percentage is based. Estimated percentages are relatively more reliable than the corresponding estimates of the numerators of the percentages, particularly if the percentages are 50 percent or more.

Table H shows the standard errors of estimated percentages of total or white persons for different sizes of the bases of the percentages. Table I shows the standard errors of estimated percentages of total or white households or families. To obtain standard errors from tables H and I for

Negroes and other races, multiply these standard errors by a factor of 1.15. The guidelines used to decide whether table F or G is appropriate for a particular item should also be used for deciding between the use of tables H and I.

Note when using small estimates. Percentage distributions are shown in this report only when the base of the percentage is greater than 75,000. Because of the large standard errors involved, there is little chance that percentages would reveal real information when computed on a smaller base. Estimated totals are shown, however, even though the relative standard errors of these totals are larger than those for the corresponding percentages. These smaller estimates are provided

primarily to permit such combinations of the categories as serve each user's needs.

Decennial Censuses. The data in this report drawn from the complete counts of the Decennial Censuses have no sampling error. It should be noted, however, that data obtained from the CPS and the data obtained from the Decennial Censuses are not entirely comparable. This is due in large part to differences in interviewer experience and training and in the differing survey processes. This accounts for an additional component of error not reflected in the standard error tables. Therefore, caution should be used in comparing results between these different sources.

Illustration. Table A of this report shows that in 1973 there were 747,000 males, married with wife absent. Table G shows the standard error on an estimate of this size to be approximately 33,000. The chances are 68 out of 100 that the estimate would have been a figure differing from a complete census figure by less than 33,000. The chances are 95 out of 100 that the estimate would have differed from a complete census figure by less than 66,000.

Of these 747,000 males, married wife absent, 53.8 percent of them were in the 35 to 64 year age bracket. Table I shows the standard error of 53.8 percent on a base of 747,000 to be approximately 2.2 percent. Consequently, chances are 68 out of 100 that the estimated 53.8 percent would be within 2.2 percentage points of a complete census figure, and chances are 95 out of 100 that the estimate would be within 4.4 percentage points of a census figure; i.e., this 95 percent confidence interval would be from 49.4 to 58.2 percent.

Differences. For a difference between two sample estimates, the standard error is approximately equal to the square root of the sum of the squares of the standard errors of each estimate considered separately. This formula will represent the actual standard error quite accurately for the difference between two estimates of the same characteristic in two different areas, or for the difference between separate and uncorrelated characteristics in the same area. If, however, there is a high positive correlation between the two characteristics, the formula will overestimate the true standard error.

Illustration of the computation of the standard error of a difference. Table A of this report shows that in 1970 there were 545,000 males married with wife absent. Thus, the apparent increase in the number of males married with wife absent between 1970 and 1973 is 202,000. The standard error of 747,000 is 33,000 as shown above. Table G shows the standard error on an estimate of 545,000 to be approximately 28,000. The standard error of the estimated difference of 202,000 is about 43,000 = $\sqrt{33,000^2 + 28,000^2}$. This means the chances are 68 out of 100 that the estimated difference based on the sample would differ from that derived using complete census figures by less than 43,000. The 68 percent confidence interval around the 202,000 difference is from 159,000 to 245,000; i.e., 202,000 $\pm$ 43,000. A conclusion that the average estimate of the difference derived from all possible samples lies within a range computed in this way would be correct for roughly 68 percent of all possible samples. The 95 percent confidence interval is 116,000 to 288,000; thus, we can conclude with 95 percent confidence that the number of males married with wife absent has increased between 1970 and 1973.
