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MARITAL STATUS AND LIVING ARRANGEMENTS: MARCH 1975

INTRODUCTION

During a relatively short span of years several dramatic changes have occurred that involve the disposition of the adult population of the United States to marry, to dissolve existing marriages, and to exercise options to enter into living arrangements which represent a departure from earlier trends. These recent developments offer wide ranging implications for present and future social and economic planning and decision-making.

This report presents detailed statistics on the marital status and living arrangements of the noninstitutional population of the United States. The report includes information on the marital status of the population 14 years old and over by age, race, and sex, family relationship, presence of parents for persons under 18 years old, and household headship by marital status for regions. The text highlights information on recent increases in age at first marriage; in the percent remaining single among young adults; in the proportion of the young single population maintaining their own households; in marital disruption through divorce and separation; in the number of female family heads; and in the frequency of children living in families where only one parent is present.

The data presented in this report were derived from the March 1975 Current Population Survey conducted by the Bureau of the Census and are subject to sampling variability, which may be relatively large for the smaller figures and for small differences between figures. For a further discussion of the sampling variability see the section on "Reliability of the Estimates."

PERCENT SINGLE AND AGE AT MARRIAGE

The observed increase during the decade of the 1960's in the proportion of adults in the United States who remained never married has continued during the first half of the 1970's (table A). Particularly notable has been the continued increase in the percent single in those age groups where most men and women have traditionally married. The proportion single among persons 20 to 24 years old (the range of years in which

the median age at first marriage for both men and women falls) increased from 28 percent in 1960 to 40 percent in 1975 for women and from 53 percent in 1960 to 60 percent in 1975 for men. The fact that the percent single for the age group 25 to 29 years has also increased during the period 1970 to 1975, after showing little change during the ten years spanning 1960 to 1970, may indicate that a general pattern of delaying marriage has gained acceptance among many young adults. Additionally, the figures may reflect the development of a trend toward larger proportions of persons remaining single throughout their entire lives, although this speculation cannot be empirically substantiated on the basis of available data.

Among the consequences of the proportional increases in young single persons has been a corresponding increase in the ages at which persons first marry. Since the early 1960's the estimated median age at first marriage has moved gradually upward, increasing by about one-half year for both men and women (tables B and C). Similarly, both the first and third quartile ages at first marriage (the estimated ages by which one-fourth and three-fourths of those who ever marry do so) have increased for both men and women. Generally, what this means is that most persons, whether they first marry at ages above or below the median, are marrying later.

The median and quartile ages at first marriage shown in this report (tables B and C) are approximations derived from tabulations of marital status by age and may yield figures that differ somewhat from those based on annual vital statistics or census questions on age at first marriage. For a discussion of the method used in estimating the median and quartile ages at marriage, see the section on "Definitions and Explanations." When the figures on median and quartile ages at first marriage for different years are compared, caution should be exercised in the interpretation of small changes. Because of sampling variability of the survey data and the limitations of the estimating technique itself, the errors in the estimates of the median age may be slightly larger than annual changes of one- or two-tenths of a year of age.

LIVING ARRANGEMENTS OF YOUNG SINGLES

As the proportion of young adults who remain single has increased, so too has the tendency for these persons to maintain their own households. Between 1970 and 1975, the number of single persons 25 to 34 years old increased by about 50 percent while the number of these persons who were heads of their own households approximately doubled (table D). Forty-three percent of the 25 to 34 year old singles were household heads in 1975 as compared with 33 percent in 1970. Most of these household heads (82 percent) in 1975 were primary individuals—persons who lived alone or with persons not related to them.

The pattern of increase in household headship between 1970 and 1975 for men 25 to 34 was generally

similar to that for women of this age. However, a somewhat larger proportion of the single women than of the single men were reported as maintaining their own household. Within primary families, a higher proportion of the women were heads whereas about equal proportions of men and women lived as primary individuals.

SEPARATION AND DIVORCE

Just as impressive as the recent increases in the percent single among the adult population has been the increased incidence of marital disruption by divorce or separation due to marital discord. In 1975, 10 percent of all ever-married persons 25 to 54 years old were reported as either divorced (and not remarried) or

separated (table E). Corresponding figures for whites and Negroes were 8 percent and 27 percent, respectively. Five years earlier, about 7 percent of all ever-married persons 25 to 54 were divorced or separated with a level of 6 percent for whites and 20 percent for Negroes. These figures reflect the marital status of persons at the time of enumeration and, thus, the data on divorced persons do not include those who had remarried after divorce, and the data on separated persons do not include those who had become reconciled after separation. No reliable data are available for the United States as a whole to indicate the extent to which separations ultimately end in divorce or in reconciliation. However, it has been reported elsewhere that an estimated four out of five divorced persons

eventually remarry.¹ Therefore, the proportion of currently divorced persons recorded at any given point in time is likely to be much smaller than the proportion of persons who have ever experienced a divorce in their lifetime.

In 1975, ever-married women 25 to 54 years old had a higher percent divorced or separated than their male counterparts. Negro men and women had a higher

proportion divorced or separated than did white men and women. Separation was reported as the dominant current form of marital disruption among Negroes, whereas divorce was reported as the dominant current form among whites.

FEMALE FAMILY HEADS AND LIVING ARRANGEMENTS OF CHILDREN

Among the consequences of the rising divorce and separation level are increases in the number and proportion of women who head families and of children who live in homes where only one parent is present.

In 1975, there were 7.2 million families in the United States maintained by women who had no husband living with them, an increase of 1.6 million since 1970. These women maintained 13 percent of all families in 1975 and 11 percent of all families in 1970. Forty-eight percent of the women heading families alone in 1975 were either divorced or separated as compared with 39 percent in 1970 (table F). Further, three-fourths of the

net increase in female family heads between 1970 and 1975 was accounted for by women who were divorced or separated.

Although women who maintain a family may be experiencing only a temporary status, the impact of their overall growth is felt in several areas including female labor force attachment, welfare reciprocity, and fertility. However, perhaps the most important single consequence of this phenomenon has been the increase in the number of children who live in families where the mother is the only parent present. Table G shows that, in 1975, 80 percent of all children under 18 years old lived with both parents, a decline from 85 percent in 1970. The proportion of both white and Negro children who lived with both parents has declined in this period. Eighty-five percent of all white children lived with two parents in 1975 as compared with only about one-half of all Negro children. Most children who lived with only one parent in 1975 lived with their mother (15 percent of all children). Eleven percent of all white children and 41 percent of all Negro children lived in families with a mother but no father present. Eight percent of all white children and 25 percent of all Negro children lived with a mother who was either divorced or separated.

RELATED REPORTS

Data for 1975 and earlier years on households and families by type were published in Series P-20, No. 282. Statistics on the characteristics of female family heads and the members of their families for 1973 and earlier years are presented in Series P-23, No. 50, "Female Family Heads."

Figures for 1974 on marital status and family status were issued in Series P-20, Nos. 271 and 276. Figures on projections for the United States of the number of households and families from 1975 to 1990 have been published in Series P-25, No. 607. Additional statistics for years since 1947 on subjects covered in this report have been published by the Bureau of the Census in other reports in Series P-20.

Statistics on marital status for 1970 for standard metropolitan statistical areas, counties, urbanized areas, cities, States, regions, and the United States are presented in **1970 Census of Population, Volume I, Characteristics of the Population**, chapter B, "General Population Characteristics." Detailed statistics on marital status and presence of spouse by age for 1970 for States and for large counties and standard metropolitan statistical areas are presented in Volume I, chapter D, "Detailed Characteristics." Similar data for the United States and regions, for 1960, have been published in **1960 Census of Population, Volume I, Characteristics of the Population, Part 1, United States Summary**.

The 1970 census report Series PC(2)-4B, **Persons by Family Characteristics**, presents statistics on the marital and family status of persons 14 years old and over, by age, race, and sex, for the United States as a whole and for urbanized areas, and on persons under 18 years old by presence and marital status of parents, for the United

States by type of residence, and for regions. In addition, this report shows all family members by age, sex, and family relationship by characteristics of the families of which they are members, including size of family, number of children, and education, occupation, and income of the family head.

The 1970 census report Series PC(2)-4C, **Marital Status**, shows detailed statistics on the marital status distribution of the population 14 years old and over by selected social and economic characteristics for the United States. Series PC(2)-4D, **Age at First Marriage**, shows detailed statistics for the United States on characteristics of persons 14 years old and over by age at first marriage, based on answers to questions on date of first marriage. In addition, the report shows average annual rates of first marriage per 1,000 single persons 14 to 79 years old in 1968 and 1969, for States. Statistics for 1970 on women by marital status, number of children ever born, and age at first marriage, are shown for the United States in Series PC (2)-3A, **Women by Number of Children Ever Born**.

APPENDIX

DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

Coverage. The population in this report includes the civilian noninstitutional population of the United States plus approximately 1,064,000 members of the Armed Forces in the United States living off post or with their families on post in 1975, but excludes all other members of the Armed Forces. However, the data in tables A and B on median and quartile ages at first marriage for males refer to the total male population, which includes, in addition to the above, the male members of the Armed Forces overseas and in military barracks and similar quarters in the United States.

Farm-nonfarm residence. The farm population refers to rural residents living on farms. The method of determining farm-nonfarm residence in the present survey and in the Current Population Surveys since March 1960 is the same as that used in the 1960 and 1970 censuses but differs from that used in earlier surveys and censuses. Since March 1960 in the Current Population Surveys, farm residence has been determined by the responses to two questions. Owners are asked "Does this place have 10 or more acres?" and renters are asked "Does the place you rent have 10 or more acres?" If the response is "Yes," the respondent is asked "During the past 12 months, did sales of crops, livestock, and other farm products from this place amount to \$50 or more?" If the acreage response is "No," the inquiry relates to sales of \$250 or more. Rural persons in motels and tourist camps, and those living on rented places where no land is used for farming, are not classified as farm population. The nonfarm population, as the term is used here, comprises persons living in urban areas and rural persons not on farms.

Although the method of determining farm-nonfarm residence has not changed since March 1971, the underlying sampling methods and estimation procedures have changed. For a discussion of changes see *Employment and Earnings*, Volume 18, No. 8, February 1972, pp. 6-9, published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Age. The age classification is based on the age of the person at the person's last birthday.

Race. The population is divided into three groups on the basis of race: white, Negro, and "other races." The last category includes Indians, Japanese, Chinese, and any other race except white and Negro.

Marital status. The marital status classification identifies four major categories: single, married, widowed, and divorced. These terms refer to the marital status at the time of the enumeration.

The category "married" is further divided into "married, spouse present," "separated," and "other married, spouse absent." A person was classified as "married, spouse present" if the husband or wife was reported as a member of the household, even though he

or she may have been temporarily absent on business or on vacation, visiting, in a hospital, etc., at the time of the enumeration. Persons reported as separated included those with legal separations, those living apart with intentions of obtaining a divorce, and other persons permanently or temporarily separated because of marital discord. The group "other married, spouse absent" includes married persons living apart because either the husband or wife was employed and living at a considerable distance from home, was serving away from home in the Armed Forces, had moved to another area, or had a different place of residence for any other reason except separation as defined above.

Husband in Armed Forces. When a woman was reported as married but her husband was not enumerated as a member of the same household an additional question was asked to determine whether her husband was in the Armed Forces. Women who were reported as separated were not asked the additional question.

Age at first marriage. The median age at first marriage, as shown in this report, is an approximation derived indirectly from tabulations of marital status and age. In computing this median, several steps are involved. First, the expected proportion of young people who will ever marry during their lifetime is computed. Second, one-half this expected proportion is calculated. And third, the current age of young people who are at this halfway mark is computed. From the assumptions made and the procedures used, it follows that the date of the survey is also the date when this halfway mark is reached. Half of the young people of the given age who will ever get married had done so prior to the survey date and half are expected to marry in years to come.

The quartile ages at first marriage divide people who will ever marry into four equal groups. The first quartile age is the age at which 25 percent of persons have married, the second quartile age (or median age) is the age at which 50 percent of persons have married, and the third quartile age is the age at which 75 percent of persons have married. The quartile ages are computed from the same distributions and involve the same assumptions as do the median ages.

In estimating the proportion of young people who will eventually marry, errors of 3 or 4 percentage points would affect the final estimate of the median age at first marriage by only 0.1 or 0.2 of a year. For convenience, the proportion ever married among persons 45 to 54 years old was used. Other age combinations could have been used with little change in the results, so long as they included very few persons who would subsequently marry for the first time.

Data on marital status were available by single years of age in censuses and by 5-year age groups in the sample surveys. Sprague's fifth difference interpolation formula was used to estimate the percent ever married by tenths of a year of age from census figures and from the sample survey data. Since the interpolation was

based on the percent ever married for 5-year age groups in the survey data, and since this percent is sensitive to changes in the distribution by single years of age within the age groups when most first marriages take place, the resulting median age at first marriage from the survey may fluctuate sharply in response to the major changes that have recently taken place in the age composition of the 20- to 24-year-old age group. The effect is marked in the case of the median age of men at first marriage because this median falls near the center of a 5-year age group. The median age of women at first marriage is relatively unaffected because little interpolation is required for its calculation; this median is now close to exact age 20, which is the lower limit of the age group.

The median age at first marriage computed from data on either annual marriage records or census questions on age at first marriage involves people over the full age span rather than just those in the vicinity of the halfway point. Median ages at first marriage based on these other records may be affected by changes in the age distribution of the population, whereas the median age at first marriage for a given date shown in the present report can be interpreted as applying to the cohort born "n" years earlier, where "n" is the median age at first marriage. Data on age at first marriage are available from marriage records only for certain States and from census questions only for selected dates.

When the figures on median and quartile ages at first marriage for different years are compared, caution should be exercised in the interpretation of small changes. Because of sampling variability of the survey data and the limitations of the estimating technique itself, the errors in the estimates of the median age may be slightly larger than annual changes of one- or two-tenths of a year of age. Moreover, there is evidence that computation of the median age at first marriage for men in some years is affected by changes in the distribution by single years of age within the age groups when most first marriages take place; changes of up to one-half year in the median for men may reflect this factor rather than any real change taking place in the ages of men at first marriage.

Household. A household consists of all the persons who occupy a housing unit. A house, an apartment, or other group of rooms, or a single room, is regarded as a housing unit when it is occupied or intended for occupancy as separate living quarters; that is, when the occupants do not live and eat with any other persons in the structure and there is either (1) direct access from the outside or through a common hall or (2) a kitchen or cooking equipment for the exclusive use of the occupants.

A household includes the related family members and all the unrelated persons, if any, such as lodgers, foster children, wards, or employees who share the housing unit. A person living alone in a housing unit, or a group of unrelated persons sharing a housing unit as partners,

is also counted as a household. The count of households excludes group quarters.

Group quarters. Group quarters are defined as non-institutional living arrangements for groups containing five or more persons unrelated to the person in charge. Inmates of institutions (starting in 1972) are not included in the Current Population Survey.

Family status. Within households, persons who are family members are distinguished from those who are not family members. A family is defined as a group of two or more persons residing together who are related by blood, marriage, or adoption; all such persons are considered as members of one family even though they may include a "subfamily," that is, a married couple or a parent-child group sharing the living quarters of the family head. A primary family includes among its members the head of a household, and a "secondary family" includes no member related to the household head. Members of secondary families may include persons such as lodgers, guests, or resident employees and their relatives living in a household.

Persons living with relatives in group quarters were formerly considered as members of secondary families. However, the number of such families became so small (37,000 in 1967) that beginning with data for 1968 (and beginning with the census data for 1960) the Bureau of the Census includes persons in these families in the count of secondary individuals.

In this report, persons who are not family members (that is, are not recognized as living with any relatives) are "unrelated individuals." Unrelated individuals are of two types—primary and secondary. A "primary individual" is a household head with no relatives in the household. A "secondary individual" is a lodger, partner, guest, or resident employee with no relatives in the household or group quarters.

Income. For the noninstitutional population 14 years old and over, questions were asked on the amount of money income received in 1974. The amounts received represent income before deductions for personal taxes, Social Security, bonds, etc. Although the income statistics refer to receipts during 1974, the characteristics of the person, such as age, marital status, etc., refer to March 1975.

Years of school completed. In this report, data on years of school completed were derived from the combination of answers to two questions, (a) "What is the highest grade of school that the person has attended?" and (b) "Did the person finish this grade?"

The questions on educational attainment applied only to progress in "regular" schools. Such schools include graded public, private, and parochial elementary and high schools (both junior and senior high), colleges, universities, and professional schools, whether day schools or night schools. Thus, "regular" schooling is that which advances a person toward an elementary or

high school diploma, or a college, university, or professional school degree. Schooling in other than regular schools was counted only if the credits obtained were regarded as transferable to a school in the regular school system.

COMPARABILITY OF ESTIMATES FROM MARCH 1975 CPS WITH ESTIMATES FOR PRECEDING YEARS

The data for 1975 collected in the March 1975 Current Population Survey (CPS) are, in some instances, not entirely comparable to figures for earlier years because of revisions in the Current Population Survey. Starting in January 1972, 1970 census-based population controls, metropolitan residence definition, and other materials were introduced into the sample and estimation procedures. The major item affecting comparability at the overall national level is the introduction of population controls based on the 1970 census. Figures for previous years are tied in with 1960 census-based population controls. Basically, these changes should

have no substantial impact on summary measures, such as medians and means, and on proportional measures, such as percent distributions. However, the changes may have more impact on the population levels in different subgroupings such as the total number of persons or families either overall, or within some particular category.

SOURCE AND RELIABILITY OF THE ESTIMATES

Source. Most of the data for this report for the years 1947-1975, except 1960, are based on results obtained in the Current Population Survey (CPS) of the Bureau of the Census. Any data before 1947 and from 1960 are based on the Decennial Censuses. Brief descriptions of the sources and for the procedures by which the data were obtained are presented below.

Current Population Survey (CPS). The following table provides a description of some aspects of the Current Population Survey design:

The estimating procedure used for the 1970-1975 data involved the inflation of weighted sample results to independent estimates of the civilian noninstitutional population of the United States by age, race, and sex. These independent estimates were based on statistics from the 1970 Census of Population, statistics on births, deaths, immigration and emigration; and statistics on the strength of the Armed Forces (Report No. 225 in this series showed somewhat different figures for 1970 since the data in that report were inflated to independent estimates of the population based on 1960 census data.) For data collected in the Current Popula-

tion Surveys in the years 1960-69, the independent estimates used were based on statistics from the 1960 Census of Population.

Decennial Census of Population. Decennial census data in this report are based on complete counts from Decennial censuses 1940 or earlier and 1960 (see table A).

Reliability of the Estimates. Since the estimates are based on a sample they may differ somewhat from the figures obtained if a complete census had been taken using the same schedules, instructions, and enumerators.

As in any survey work, the results are subject to errors of response and of reporting as well as being subject to sampling variability.

The reliability of an estimate is described in terms of standard errors which are primarily measures of sampling variability, that is, of the variations that occur by chance because a sample rather than the whole of the population is surveyed. As calculated for this report, the CPS standard errors also partially measure the effect of response and enumeration errors but do not measure any systematic biases in the data. The chances are about 68 out of 100 that an estimate from the CPS sample would differ from a complete census figure by less than the standard error. The chances are about 90 out of 100 that the difference would be less than 1.6 times the standard error, and the chances are about 95 out of 100 that the difference would be less than twice the standard error.

All statements of comparison appearing in the text are significant at a 1.6 standard error level or better. Most are significant at a level of more than 2.0 standard errors. Thus, for most differences cited in the text, the estimated difference is greater than twice the standard error of the difference. Statements of comparison qualified in some way, e.g., by use of the phrase "some evidence," have a level of significance between 1.6 and 2.0 standard errors.

The figures presented in tables A-1, A-2, A-3, A-4, A-5, A-6, A-7, and A-8 are approximations to the standard errors of various estimates shown in this report. In order to derive standard errors that would be applicable to a wide variety of items and could be prepared at a moderate cost, a number of approximations were required. In addition, where two or more items have nearly the same standard errors, one table is used to represent them. As a result, the tables of standard errors provide an indication of the order of magnitude of the standard error rather than the precise standard error for any specific item. Standard errors for values within the ranges of the tables may be approximated by interpolation.

The standard errors in the tables can be used for the years 1967-1975. Data from CPS prior to January 1967 are not as reliable as data from the current sample. Thus, to obtain the standard error for an estimate from June 1956-1966 (σ_0), multiply the standard error from the table for an estimate of that size (σ) by 1.2, i.e.,

$$\sigma_0 = 1.2\sigma.$$

Similarly for data from CPS prior to 1956, multiply the standard errors from the tables by 1.5.

Tables A-1 and A-2 contain the standard errors of estimates of the number of persons in a given class. Table A-1 contains standard errors of the number of

total or white persons and table A-2 contains the standard errors of the number of persons of Negro and other races.

Tables A-5 and A-7 contain the standard errors of estimates of the number of families, households, or unrelated individuals. Table A-5 should be used for total or white families, households or unrelated individuals, and table A-7 should be used for Negro and other races families, households or unrelated individuals. Tables A-5 and A-7 should also be used for items which can typically appear only once in a given household, as for example, "number of household heads," or "number of female household heads."

The reliability of an estimated percentage, computed by using sample data for both numerator and denominator, depends upon both the size of the percentage and the size of the total upon which this percentage is based.

Estimated percentages are relatively more reliable than the corresponding estimates of the numerator of the percentages, particularly if the percentages are 50 percent or more.

Table A-3 shows the standard errors of estimated percentages of total or white persons for different sizes of the bases of the percentages. Table A-4 shows the standard errors of estimated percentages of persons of Negro and other races. Tables A-6 and A-8 contain the standard errors of estimates of percentages of families, households, or unrelated individuals. Table A-6 should be used for total or white families, households or unrelated individuals, and table A-8 should be used for Negro and other races families, households or unrelated individuals. The guideline used to decide whether tables A-5 and A-7 are appropriate for a particular item should also be used for deciding the use of tables A-6 and A-8.

Note when using small estimates. Percentage distributions are shown in this report only when the base of the percentage is greater than 75,000. Because of the large standard errors involved, there is little chance that percentages would reveal real information when computed on a smaller base. Estimated totals are shown, however, even though the relative standard errors of these totals are larger than those for the corresponding percentages. These smaller estimates are provided primarily to permit such combinations of the categories as serve each user's needs.

Illustration of the use of tables of standard errors. Table D of this report shows that there were 2,539,000 single males 25-34 years old as of March 1975. Table

A-1 shows the standard error on an estimate of this size to be approximately 94,000. The chances are 68 out of 100 that the estimate would have been a figure differing from a complete census figure by less than 94,000. The chances are 95 out of 100 that the estimate would have differed from a complete census figure by less than 188,000.

Of these 2,539,000 single men 25-34 years old, 48.2 percent were in families and not head of households. Table A-6 shows the standard error of 48.2 percent on a base of 2,539,000 to be approximately 1.2 percent. Consequently, chances are 68 out of 100 that the estimated 48.2 percent would be within 1.2 percentage points of a complete census figure, and chances are 95 out of 100 that the estimate would be within 2.4 percentage points of a census figure, i.e., this 95 percent confidence interval would be from 45.8 to 50.6 percent.

EXCEPTION TO USE OF TABLES

Estimates of divorced persons per 1,000 married persons with spouse present. The standard error on an estimate of the number of divorced persons per 1,000 married persons with spouse present cannot be calculated directly from these standard error tables. The estimate involves the ratio of the total persons divorced, x , to the total number of married persons with spouse present, y , multiplied by 1,000. The standard error of this estimate is calculated by following formula:

$$\frac{\sigma_x}{y} (1000) = \left[\left(\frac{x}{y} \right)^2 \left(\frac{\sigma^2 y}{y^2} + \frac{\sigma^2 x}{x^2} \right) \right]^{1/2} (1000).$$

The standard errors of the estimates of the total number of divorced persons, σ_x , and the standard error of the total number of married persons with spouse present, σ_y , should both be calculated from table A-1.

Standard error of a difference. For a difference between two sample estimates, the standard error is approximately equal to the square root of the sum of the squares of the standard errors of each estimate considered separately. This formula will represent the actual standard error quite accurately for the difference between two estimates of the same characteristic in two different areas, or for the difference between separate and uncorrelated characteristics in the same area. If, however, there is a high positive correlation between the two characteristics, the formula will overestimate the true standard error.

Illustration of the computation of the standard error of a difference. Table D of the report shows that in 1970 there were 1,740,000 single men 25-34 years old. Thus, the apparent difference between single males 25-34 years old in 1970 and 1975 is 799,000. The standard error of 2,539,000 is 94,000 as shown above. Table A-1 shows the standard error on an estimate of 1,740,000 to be approximately 76,000. To get the standard error of the estimated change, the standard error of a difference formula is used as follows:

$$\sigma_{x-y} = \sqrt{\sigma_x^2 + \sigma_y^2}.$$

Therefore, the standard error of the estimated change of 799,000 is about

$$121,000 = \sqrt{(94,000)^2 + (76,000)^2}.$$

This means the chances are 68 out of 100 that the estimated difference based on the samples would differ from the change derived using complete census figures

by less than 121,000. The 68 percent confidence interval around the 799,000 difference is from 678,000 to 920,000, i.e., $799,000 \pm 121,000$. A conclusion that the average estimate of the change derived from all possible samples lies within a range computed in this way would be correct for roughly 68 percent of all possible samples. The 95 percent confidence interval is 557,000 to 1,041,000 and thus we can conclude with 95 percent confidence that the number of single men 25-34 years old in 1975 is actually greater than the number of single men 25-34 years old in 1970.
